## Full Skating Membership Entitles You To . . .

### Group Instruction

Group Instruction is available to every Full Skating Member of the Club at no additional charge. Be sure to read the information that follows, especially regarding the area of skating that interests you. Members of all ages and abilities are encouraged to take advantage of these classes.

The Club offers a Power Skating class on Sunday afternoon between 1:55 PM and 2:50 p.m. for skaters of all ages and abilities. The Power Skating session is designed for both the Figure and Hockey skater.

### Family Skating

Family Sessions are open to all Full Skating Club Members and are held Saturday afternoon at 1:00 p.m. and Sunday afternoon at 2:50 p.m. These sessions are for the FAMILY, no age restrictions, no ability levels, just a great time for the family to skate together and enjoy our facility. Participants are reminded to please adhere to our skating rules for the safety of all skaters.

### Recreational Skating

#### For Juniors (under 18 years of age)

**Preschool Sessions** are for all children below first grade. Sessions are held every Monday and Thursday afternoon at 12:45 p.m. Children are encouraged to skate both days. It is strongly recommended that an adult accompany a preschool child. Free group instruction will be given on both days.

#### Basic Skills Sessions (Kindergarten and up)

These sessions are designed for all beginner children to learn the basic skills needed by both Figure and Hockey skaters. The sessions are offered: Friday 4:30 PM – 5:15 PM, Saturday 12:00 PM – 1:00 PM, Sunday 1:55 PM – 2:50 PM. These sessions combine Low and High Basic Skills. Low Basic Skills (children working on USFS Basic Skills Level 1-5 or Hockey Level 1-4); and High Basic Skills (children working on USFS

Basic Skills Level 6-8, Freestyle and Hockey skaters above Level 4). Children will be evaluated in the beginning of Club Season and placed into the appropriate Basic Skills Level Group by the Basic Skills Recording Professional. Children are welcome to skate all days of their designated ice time and will have a group lesson on at least one designated day. Each Basic Skills Session will provide time for group lesson classes, and practice time. Consistent attendance during lessons is strongly encouraged so that children can progress to testing for the next Basic Skill Level. USFS patches will be awarded when a child successfully completes the testing at each Basic Skills level.

## ***Figure Skating & Ice Dancing***

---

**MIF/Freestyle Sessions** are for practicing USFS moves in the field, freestyle and dance. Skaters must have passed Basic Skills level 8 in order to participate in these sessions. All skaters participating in these sessions must adhere to the MIF/Freestyle guidelines posted at the Club. Private lessons with Club Professionals are conducted at these sessions.

**Junior dancers** are permitted to attend certain Senior Skating and Dance Sessions, subject to the approval of the Senior Sessions Chair.

**Philadelphia Symmetry Synchronized Skating Teams:** WSC is the home of Philadelphia Symmetry Synchronized Skating Teams. Synchronized Skating is the fastest growing discipline in figure skating and is on its way to becoming a recognized NCAA sport, opening the door to college scholarships. Presently Philadelphia Symmetry has four teams, with skaters ranging in age from 7 – 18 years old. Ashleigh Renard is the Director of Synchronized Skating for WSC. WSC also has an "Intro to Synchro" program, allowing skaters of all ages and ability levels to try out this exciting and evolving team sport. ## **For Seniors (18 years of age and older)**

Any session designated as Senior Skating in the Daily Sessions Schedule is open to all skating members 18 years of age and older. They may also skate at the Adult Session on Sunday.

"Freestyle" is permitted on weekday mornings, Monday-Friday or during Sunday evening Senior Session (Seniors only). No freestyle is permitted during Family Sessions.

### **Senior Sessions:**

**Senior Skating** is held on weekday mornings and is open to any senior member, regardless of level.

**Senior Figure Sessions (18 years of age and older)** are held on Sunday. Group instruction will be given on Sunday. To begin ice-skating, ice dancing or to brush up on basics, attend Sunday evening class at 7:45 p.m. followed by one hour of practice. Classes include basic skating, stroking, and preliminary dance instruction.

## ***Private Instruction***

---

The Club Professionals are available for private instruction during the season. The rates are for **half-hour private lessons** - shorter lesson periods may be arranged. Arrangements are made directly with the Professional of your choice.

A list of the Club Professionals for private skating instruction will be provided to Club Members prior to the opening of the Club season. Call Lydia at 215-247-1759 Extension #13 to obtain a copy or stop by the front office to pick up a copy.

## ***Pro Shop***

---

The WSC Pro Shop is run for the primary benefit of our Club Members. Every year we make an effort to expand our variety of products and will "special order" what we do not stock. We offer a 10% discount on all special orders. Your patronage supports WSC activities.

The Pro Shop is open daily, evenings and weekends. Full service repairs are available on equipment and skates, as well as professional sharpening of figure and hockey skates.

As a courtesy to Club Members, Pro Shop purchases may be charged to your account. A statement reflecting monthly purchases will be mailed the first of each month and payment is expected before the end of that month. If payment has not been received by the 60th day, a member's name will be posted and membership privileges will be suspended.

The Pro Shop offers the Skate Lease program to help defray members' equipment costs. Under the Skate Lease Program, children's skates are leased for one year at a competitive rate and may be exchanged for a larger size as necessary. We lease skates up to Adult Size 4.

## Junior Boys and Girls Hockey Program (available for players ages 5 through 18)

Team evaluations take place in the Spring. Teams practice independently at their discretion during summer months. Practice and game slots will be allotted to all teams following Labor Day. Age classifications for the 2009-2010 season are as follows:

<b>Mite Level</b>	2001 and younger
<b>Squirt Level</b>	1999 and 2000
<b>Pee Wee Level</b>	1997 and 1998
<b>Bantam Level</b>	1995 and 1996
<b>Midget Level</b>	1991, 1992, 1993 and 1994
<b>Girls U16 Level</b>	1993 and 1994

The Developmental Cross Ice Program varies from year to year depending on the number of players. The focus is skills development and fun for young players new to the game.

Teams projected for the 2009-2010 season are:

Mite A, Mite B, Squirt A, Squirt B,  
Pee Wee A, Bantam A, Bantam B,  
Midget U16A, Midget U18AA, and Girls U16.

During our spring evaluations, players are tentatively rostered to a team and level that is appropriate to the player's age and skill. Final rostering occurs during our August pre-season practices, and that becomes the team to which the player is assigned.

However, for reasons of safety, each player must pass individual skating skills assessment appropriate to his/her team level prior to their permitted play in competitive games.

## Senior Hockey (19 years of age and older)

Open to all members, space permitting. We offer the opportunity to participate in both informal scrimmages and competitive hockey games at the A, B, C, Novice, and Old Timers (over 40) level. Eligibility to play on any Senior Team will be based on: availability of player slots, ability level, willingness to attend away games, and approval of the Senior Hockey Committee and team captains. All team players will be required to abide by Senior Hockey Committee rules regarding protective equipment and behavior.

Team jerseys are mandatory and are available in the WSC Pro Shop. All senior team game schedules will be available through the Senior Hockey Committee. Senior Hockey may require additional fees for insurance.

## Women's Hockey Friday 12:30 PM – 1:30 PM

Open to all women members over the age of 18. This is run as a group practice with informal scrimmages. Emphasis is on having fun while developing skills. No previous hockey experience is necessary. Helmets, gloves, shin pads and elbow pads are required, but full equipment is strongly recommended.

## Family Hockey

Open to all Full Skating Members and their children through age 13. **No guests permitted.** This is a low-key, fun session and is intended to encourage family involvement. This session is especially appealing to young people interested in learning to play hockey. Helmets, gloves, shin pads and elbow pads are mandatory in order to participate in these sessions. Children are required to wear full equipment if they participate in informal scrimmages.

**NOTE: Families with more than one person participating in Junior or Senior Hockey and/or Junior or Senior Figure or Synchro will be charged a participant fee for each additional person. See note under Membership and Dues on page 5.**

## **General Information Regarding the Junior Hockey Program**

1. All players are sent registration and health forms which must be returned before the first practice.
2. Games will be scheduled for each team based on the level of play. Teams will practice 1 or 2 times per week depending on the level and availability of ice. Players and families should be committed to attending all practices and games in a timely manner. Where lateness or absence is unavoidable, notifying the coaches and/or team manager as soon as possible is essential.
3. Each player is required to have a white helmet, WSC blue shell and home and away socks. Team jerseys are property of WSC and will be issued and collected each season. Proper care is the player and family's responsibility.
4. Every player is required to wear full H.E.C.C. protective equipment at all practices and games. Check in at the WSC Pro Shop to be sure of proper size and fit. Beginning players should be fitted for skates in the WSC Pro Shop. The Lease program is available for hockey skates through the WSC Pro Shop.
5. Parents are encouraged to assist with car-pooling, providing refreshments, etc. The Junior Hockey Committee requests the participation of anyone interested in organizing and formulating the junior hockey programs seasonal activities and teams.

## **Skating Rules**

---

Ice skating presents a risk of injury. Skate at your own risk. All posted safety rules at the rink must be followed.

### **Rules of Conduct**

---

One reason WSC is special is that it has many different skating programs, with a diverse group of people of all ages, skating abilities and interests using our Club. We all feel special about WSC and we all want to enjoy our membership. Please review the rules of conduct with the skating and non-skating members of your household and encourage them to be aware of their conduct and adhere to the Club rules when using the ice and the common off ice areas. The result will be that we will all be able to enjoy our Club. As a reminder, please note that:

1. Wearing hockey equipment (including hockey gloves) is not permitted on Family Sessions or Basic Skills.
2. Gloves or mittens should be worn on all sessions.
3. Wearing helmets is mandatory for skaters on Preschool Sessions, Family Sessions and Basic Skills Sessions through Level 5.
4. Hockey sticks, pucks, balls and wearing skates are not permitted in the Muehlbronner Lounge.
5. Running and loud behavior is not permitted in the common off ice areas and in particular in the Muehlbronner Lounge.
6. Smoking is not permitted in the building. Eating, drinking or gum chewing on the ice is not permitted. Please do not litter or spit on the floor. Foul language is not acceptable at the Club. Respect the ice and your Club.
7. Children or other items may not be carried while skating.
8. No one may be on the ice without skates.
9. No one may sit on the dasher boards at any time.
10. Rink equipment can be dangerous. All skaters must leave the ice during resurfacing.
11. Do not loiter in the locker rooms. Improper conduct by any member, guest, or staff in the locker rooms will result in disciplinary action from the Jr. Hockey Committee or Board of Directors.
12. Improper conduct on or off the ice may lead to suspension of Club privileges per the WSC By-laws.

### **Sessions Policies:**

**Preschool Sessions:** Helmets and gloves or mittens are **mandatory**.

**Basic Skills Skating and Family Sessions:** Helmets are required through Basic Skills Level 5. Thereafter, skaters may elect not to wear helmets, but by so doing they knowingly assume the risk of possible injury. The Club recommends that skaters always wear helmets, regardless of skill level. Gloves or mittens are **mandatory**.

## **Guest Rules**

---

**Members must accompany all guests and personally register them in the Guest Book, which is kept in the Pro Shop.** The Guest Fee of \$10.00 (which includes rental skates) should be paid in the Pro Shop prior to entering the ice.

1. No guests under 18 years of age may be brought to skate at any Club Session except as follows:
  - a. Children's guests at the Family Skating Session on Saturday and Sunday afternoons, provided they are accompanied by a senior member. (A member cannot bring in more than two guests except for birthday parties.)
  - b. Out-of-town house guests living more than forty miles away.
2. Senior Club Members may bring adult guests (regardless of where they live) to any Senior or Family Skating Session.
3. No one person may be brought as a guest more than three times per season.
4. Upon payment of the regular Club Guest Fee, Non-Skating Members of the Club may skate at five Family Skating Sessions, 1:00 PM Saturday and 2:50 PM Sunday. (Weekday Morning Senior Sessions or Senior Hockey Scrimmages are not included.)
5. Year Round, Full Skating Members may skate during any Guest Member Sessions without payment of the admission fee. Members must sign in at the gate with the Manager on duty, identify themselves as Club Members and Manager will then verify their membership.
6. Schedule may change at the discretion of the manager. Changes will be posted on the bulletin board.
7. Guests for Senior Hockey scrimmages will be charged a fee of \$10.00. Guest participation in hockey scrimmages is always dependent on how full the session is at any given time.

### **Spectator Guest Rules**

---

1. Senior members may bring spectator guests of any age to any of the Club Sessions.
2. Junior members (i.e. under 18 years of age) **MAY NOT** bring spectator guests to any Club Sessions except for hockey games and competitions.
3. Adhere to upstairs lounge rules posted on Bulletin Board.

## Notice To Members

The following membership categories are available:

### Annual Dues

#### FULL SKATING MEMBERSHIPS:

Family: ..... \$1,850.00

The annual dues for this category of membership entitle family members to designated Club Sessions and social events. Families with more than one person participating in Junior or Senior Figure, and/or Synchro Team and/or Junior or Senior Hockey will be charged a participation fee for each additional person enrolled in activities other than Family Skating, Family Hockey, Preschool, and Basic Skating Sessions: Each additional participant is charged \$700.00 per Club season.

Individual: (Age 18 and older)..... \$1,550.00

The annual dues for this category of membership entitle the individual member to designated Club Sessions and social events.

#### Associate MEMBERSHIPS:

##### JUNIOR FIGURE MEMBERSHIP:

Individual: ..... \$950.00

For those under 18 years of age. Must have passed Basic Skills level 4 or beyond. May skate in all Freestyle and Basic Skills sessions.

##### SYNCHRO MEMBERSHIP:

Individual: ..... \$1,050.00

For those under age 18. Must have passed Basic Skills level 4 or beyond. May skate in all Freestyle, Basic Skills sessions and on one Synchronized Skating Team.

SENIOR ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP: ..... \$550.00

This membership is for those ages 18 and older. They are entitled to skate during Senior Sessions and they may participate in the senior group lessons.

NON-SKATING MEMBERSHIP: ..... \$125.00

Available to Full Skating Members in good standing who apply for a change prior to August 1st of the season for which the change is requested. This category includes use of the Club facilities and voting privileges, but skating is limited to five Family Skating Sessions annually. (Saturday 1:00 – 1:45 PM and Sunday 2:50 – 3:45 PM) There is no hockey privilege with this membership. Non-Skating members pay \$10.00 per session per person.

This class of membership has the privilege of later requesting reinstatement to any membership classification. To do so, they must notify the Treasurer via the office. If any of the Club's programs are fully subscribed, the Treasurer will notify the Membership VP and the Sessions' Chairpersons to be sure there is space in the Club program of interest. The Non-Skating member will be advised of the situation.

#### GUEST MEMBERSHIPS:

Junior Introductory: ..... \$700.00

The annual dues for this category of membership entitles each member under 18 to skate in Freestyle, Basic Skills, Tots sessions, and/or on one Synchronized team. This membership holds no voting rights nor any other WSC membership privileges. After one Club Season, members in this category must submit to the membership process for Full Skating, Synchro, or Junior Figure Membership, which includes payment of the Initiation Fee.

Mite Cross Ice Hockey:..... \$750.00

This membership category is for each first year Mite Ice Hockey player. Each player may participate in weekly cross ice practices and games and one basic skills session.

The two guest memberships above are for single skaters only and participation is limited to one year. Full membership is required after one year.

Midget Ice Hockey:..... \$1,350.00

This membership is for qualified Midget Ice Hockey players only. Each player may participate in the practice and game sessions for his or her specific Midget team.

#### Competitive Sr. "A" Hockey:

1<sup>st</sup> year (ages 18 – 35)..... \$700.00

2<sup>nd</sup> and subsequent years (ages 18 – 26)..... \$925.00

2<sup>nd</sup> and subsequent years (ages 27 – 35)..... \$1,550.00

Players between the ages of 18 and 35, who have the required size and skills, are eligible for available positions on the Senior "A" team. Upon acceptance, players must pay annual dues in full, but, if under the age of 27, are exempt from the Initiation Fee. This membership is restricted to Senior "A" hockey ice time and holds neither voting nor any other membership privileges. If a player turns 27 prior to the first day of Club Season, this member would be responsible for dues and Initiation Fee of the Full Skating Individual Membership.

Clergy:..... \$300.00

Active Military:..... \$300.00

#### Initiation Fee

New Full Skating and Junior Figure Members and Synchro are subject to an Initiation Fee of \$250.00 due upon acceptance of Club Membership. *No skating privileges will be allowed before Initiation Fee is paid.* Non-Skating and Guest Memberships are not subject to this fee.

## **Junior Hockey Reservation Deposit**

A per player deposit is due by May 1st, or upon acceptance, to reserve a spot in the Junior Hockey Program. Deposit will be credited against Club Dues for each player rostered on a WSC team. Deposit amount and due date are determined by the Junior Hockey Committee and communicated to the membership in March or April. This deposit is **non-refundable**. An additional late fee is assessed for deposits that are not received by the announced due date.

## **Payment of Dues & Other Charges**

Dues will be billed on August 1<sup>st</sup>. One half of the balance is due by August 31<sup>st</sup>. The remainder of the balance is due no later than September 30<sup>th</sup>. Club dues and other charges shall be billed to each member on the basis of information on file at the Club office. If a member fails to notify the office in writing prior to August 1st of a change in membership status, the member will be liable for the ensuing year's dues at the same rate for the category of membership for the current year.

**Payment Policy: If a member fails to pay any charges when due, his/her name shall be posted on the Club Bulletin Board and notice of such posting will be forwarded to him/her in accordance with the By-Laws. No member so posted shall be eligible to skate, vote, be entered into any Club test or competition, or use any facility of the Club. The Board of Directors will strictly enforce these rules. Pro Shop charges will be billed monthly and are due within 30 days of statement date.**

## **Resignations**

If a Club Member wishes to resign, he/she must submit written notice to the Secretary of the Board of Directors prior to August 1st. Failure to receive this written notice shall make the member liable for the ensuing year's dues at the same rate for the category of membership for the current year. If a member is in arrears, resignation shall not be accepted.

A member who resigns relinquishes all rights and privileges of Club Membership. If a member later decides to rejoin, he/she must repeat the admission process and will be charged the current Initiation Fee.

## **Membership, Ms. Pamela M. Nason, Chair**

In order for a candidate to be considered by the Membership Committee, the following procedures must take place:

1. WSC Membership Application must be completed by candidate and then signed by a sponsor.
2. WSC Sponsor Questionnaire must be completed.
3. Two (2) supporting letters from members (sponsor and one seconder) must be submitted.
4. One personal reference letter from someone who has known the candidate for several years.
5. Names and addresses of candidates shall be mailed to each member and posted on the Club Bulletin Board **at least two weeks prior to election to membership.**
6. Candidate must be met by the Membership Committee at a Meet & Greet.
7. After reviewing applications and meeting candidates, the Membership Committee shall have the power of election.

During the posting period, skating is not permitted by a candidate, except by special permission of the Chair of the Membership Committee.

No member of the Board of Directors, the Membership Committee, or the candidate's immediate family may propose or second a candidate.

No member shall be permitted to propose or second a candidate until he has been a member of the Club for one (1) full year, and no member may submit more than three (3) letters to propose or second a candidate for membership during any single Club year. More specific information can be obtained from the Chair of the Membership Committee.
